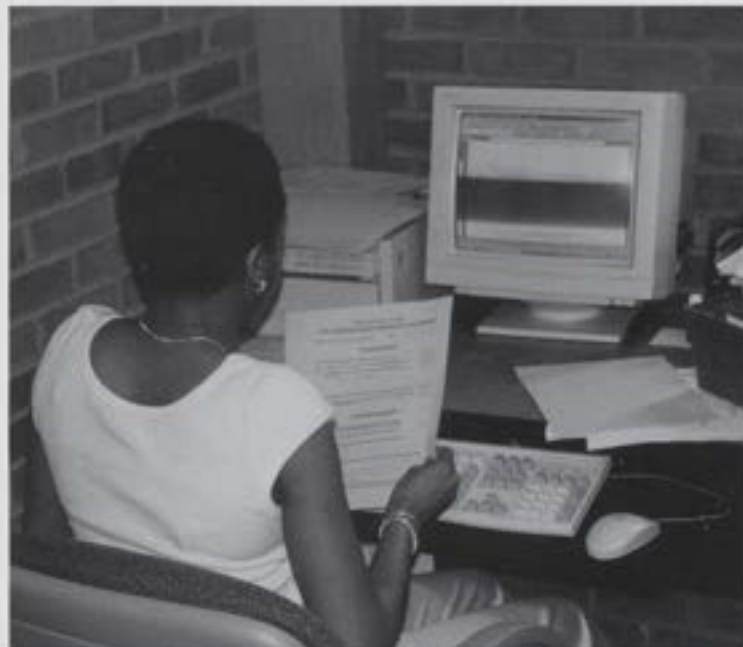

R-MC Students to Spend Summer Splashing in Research

"...the 33 students participating in Randolph-Macon College's Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowships (SURF), since June 8 have been looking forward to attending the school's research conference August 7. Hanoverians might find themselves becoming involved in the SURF program as members of a focus group or being asked to fill out surveys.

The students are given a \$2,500 stipend for the summer and live on campus. Three students are doing research outside the country in nations ranging from France to Sweden. The SURF program enjoys a financial endowment of roughly \$1 million, created by the support of R-MC trustee Ben Schapiro. Not all those participating in the SURF program receive money solely from the Schapiro endowment, however, SURF sources say.



At the end of the program, each student gives a 10-minute talk before a crowd of roughly 70 people, SURF co-director Kelly Lambert said.

'This is really a journey of discovery for them,' Lambert said. 'It's knowing that the answers are not in the back of the book.'"

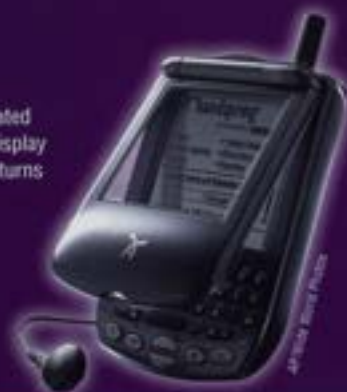

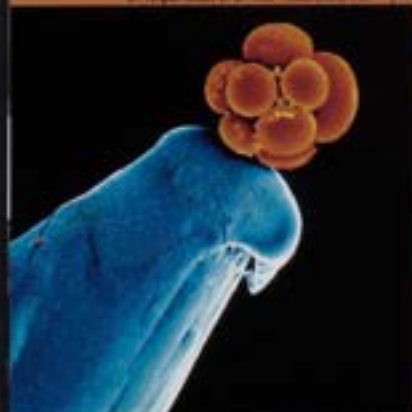

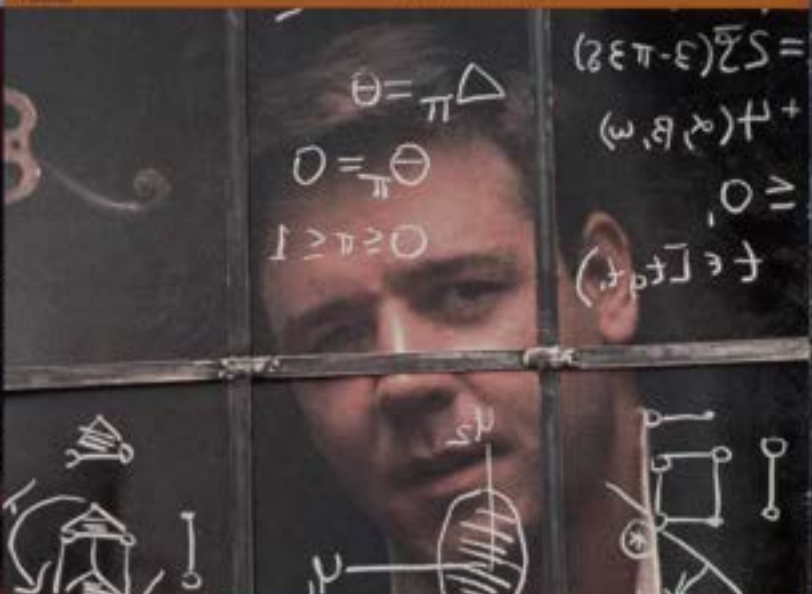

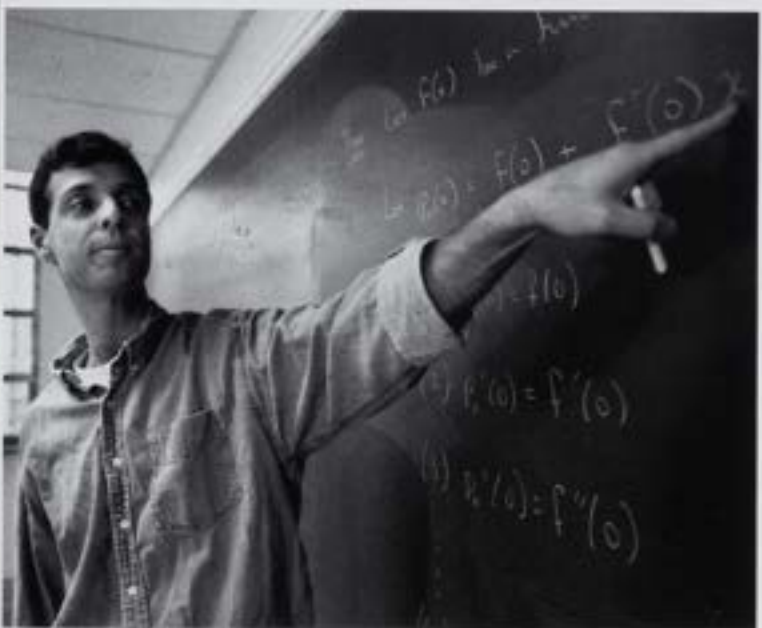
