

















































# R-MC's President











Randolph-Macon College senior Ali-American guard Megan Silva has been named the national Division III Player of the Year by three different organizations for the 2005-2006 season. Silva also received the prestigious Jostens Trophy, an award given annually to one female and one male Division III basketball player for excellence on the court, in the classroom and in community service. In her career, she totaled more points [2,371], assists [700] and steals [446] than any male OR female player all-time in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference. Silva also totaled 554 career rebounds, and started in every single game over her four years — 121 contests. Her career per-game averages included 19.6 points, 5.8 assists, 3.7 steals and 4.6 rebounds.
