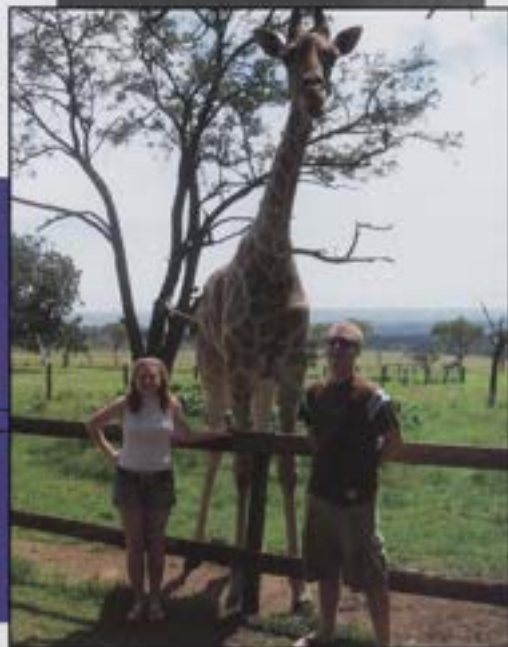

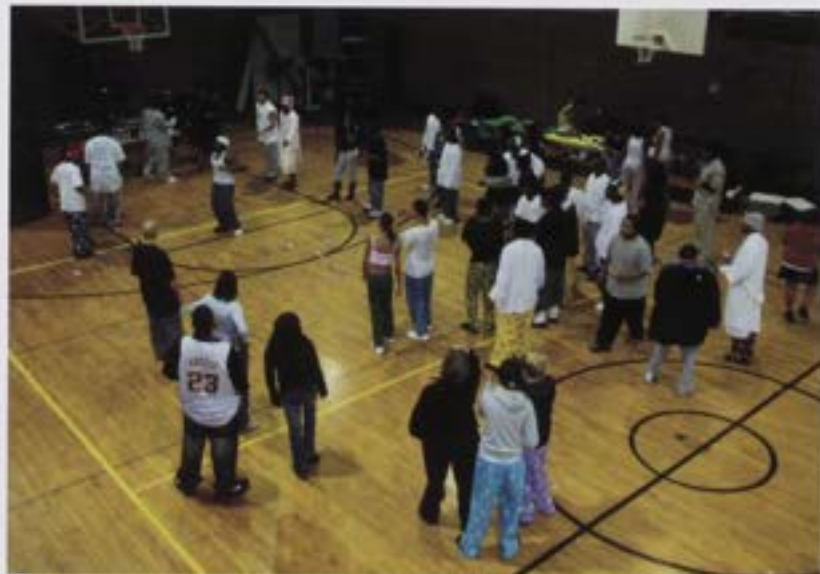

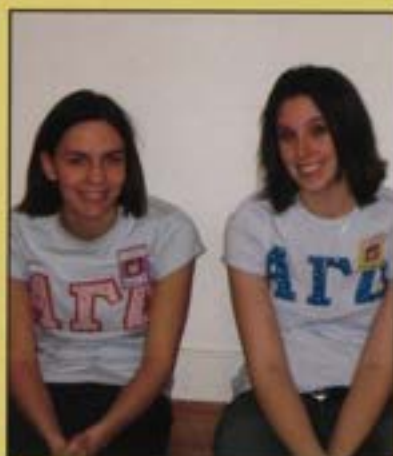

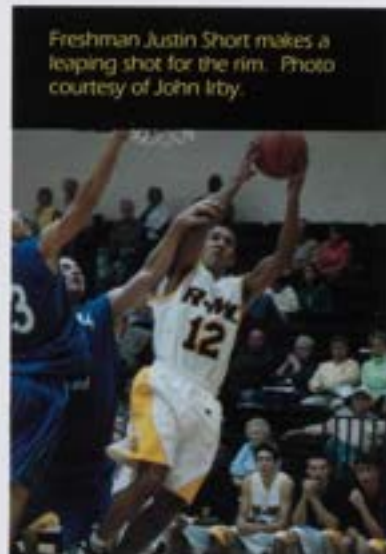

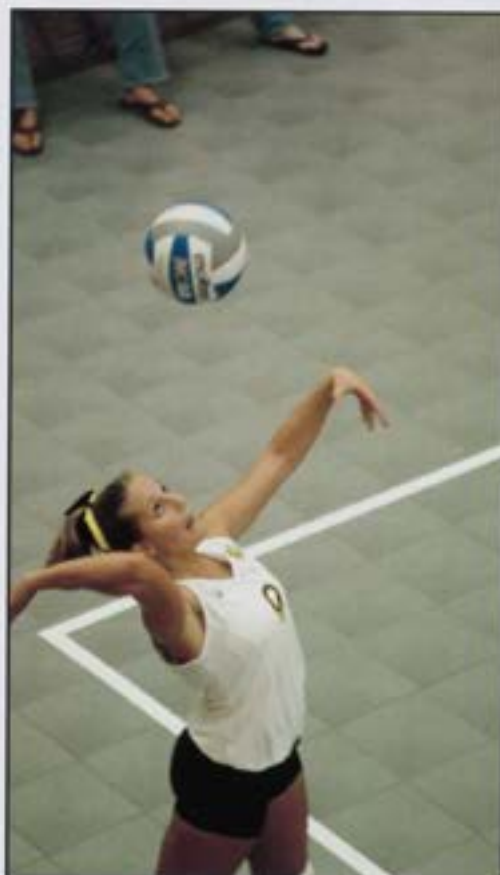

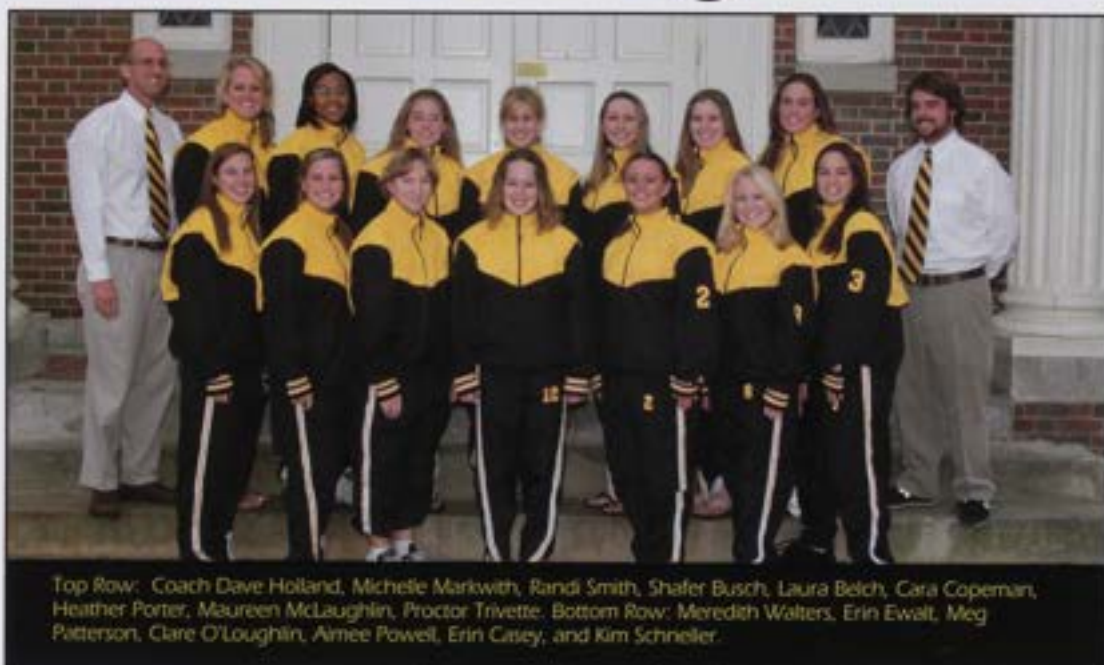

Earlier this fall, President Roger Martin announced his retirement following nine years of dedicated service to the college.

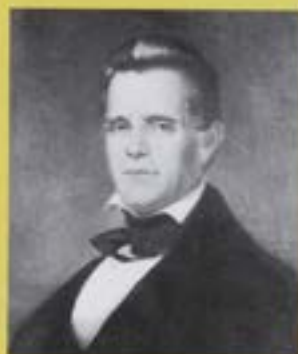

Silva also received the prestigious Jostens Trophy, an award given annually to one female and one male Division III basketball player for excellence on the court, in the classroom and in community service. In her career, she totaled more points (2,371), assists (700) and steals (446) than any male OR female player all-time in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference. Silva also totaled 554 career rebounds, and started in every single game over her four years – 121 contests. Her career per-game averages included 19.6 points, 5.8 assists, 3.7 steals and 4.6 rebounds.
