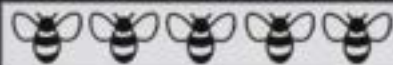

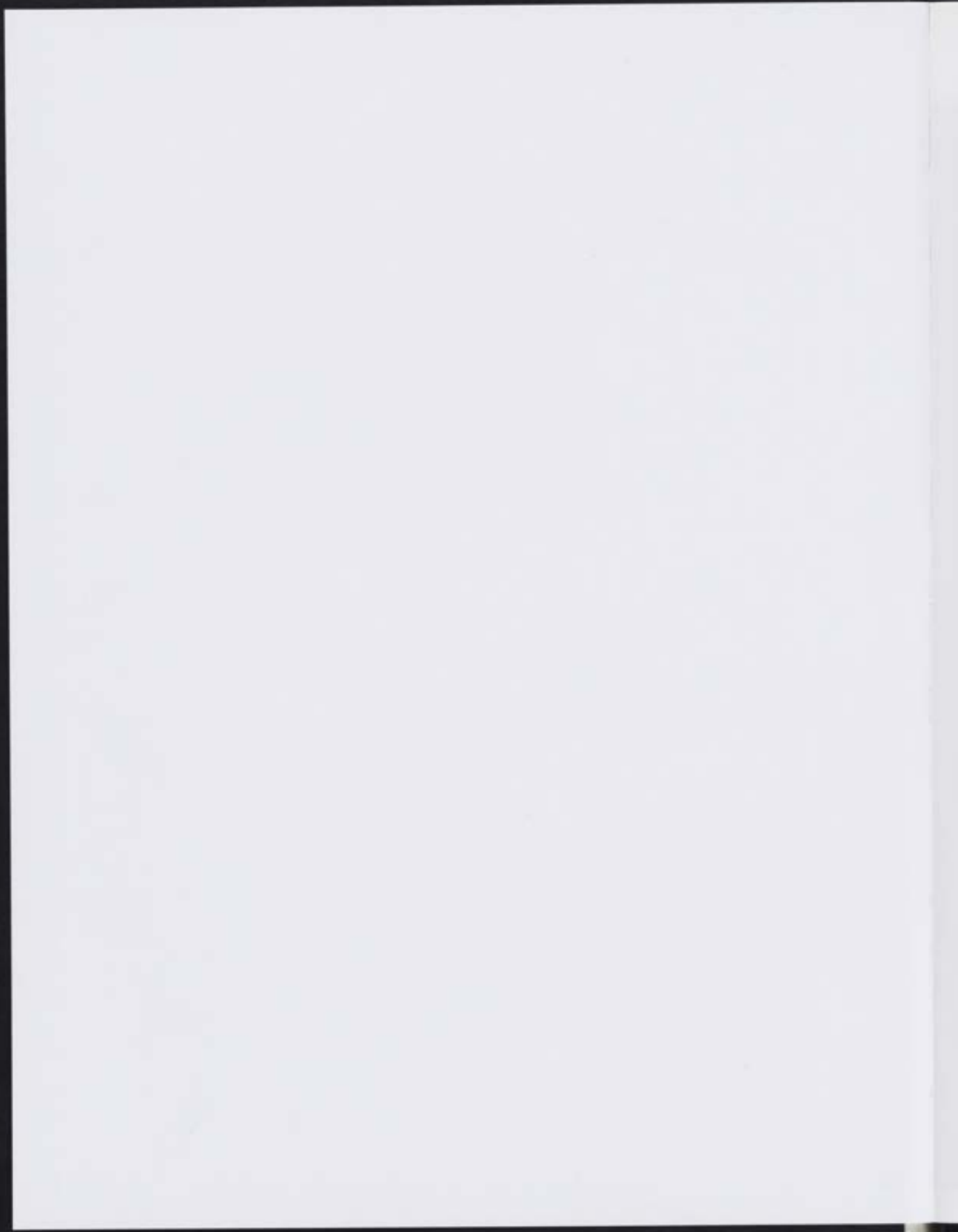

FDS also annually hosts the Washington-Franklin Cup debate tournament where a school from Virginia, the Northeast and the South are invited to compete against R-MC.

Brothers For Change

B4C is a group of Randolph-Macon men who, regardless of ethnic or socioeconomic background, work together to promote leadership, diversity and responsibility throughout the campus and community. B4C participates in community day, does yardwork or other chores for members of the community and volunteers at various organizations throughout the year.





The **Organization for Sexual Minorities and Allies** promotes awareness, respect and acceptance of all people, especially sexual minorities on campus and in the greater community.



#### Macon Peer Response

Members of MPR provide supportive and companion services to survivors of sexual assault and/or domestic violence on campus. MPR also advocates and educates the campus community on these issues. National Domestic/Dating Violence Awareness Month and National Sexual Assault Awareness Month are recognized on campus by events MPR puts together. MPR also annually hosts Take Back the Night and the R-MC Clothesline Project.

#### Students for Environmental Action

SEA hosted several events in the fall, one being the Recycled Art Contest (photo at left - two participants pose with their creation) that showed students used materials can be reused rather than thrown away. SEA members collect ink cartridges from the academic buildings and recycle them and also writes letters to Congressmen encouraging them to support the Chesapeake Clean Water Act and the Clean Energy Job Act.

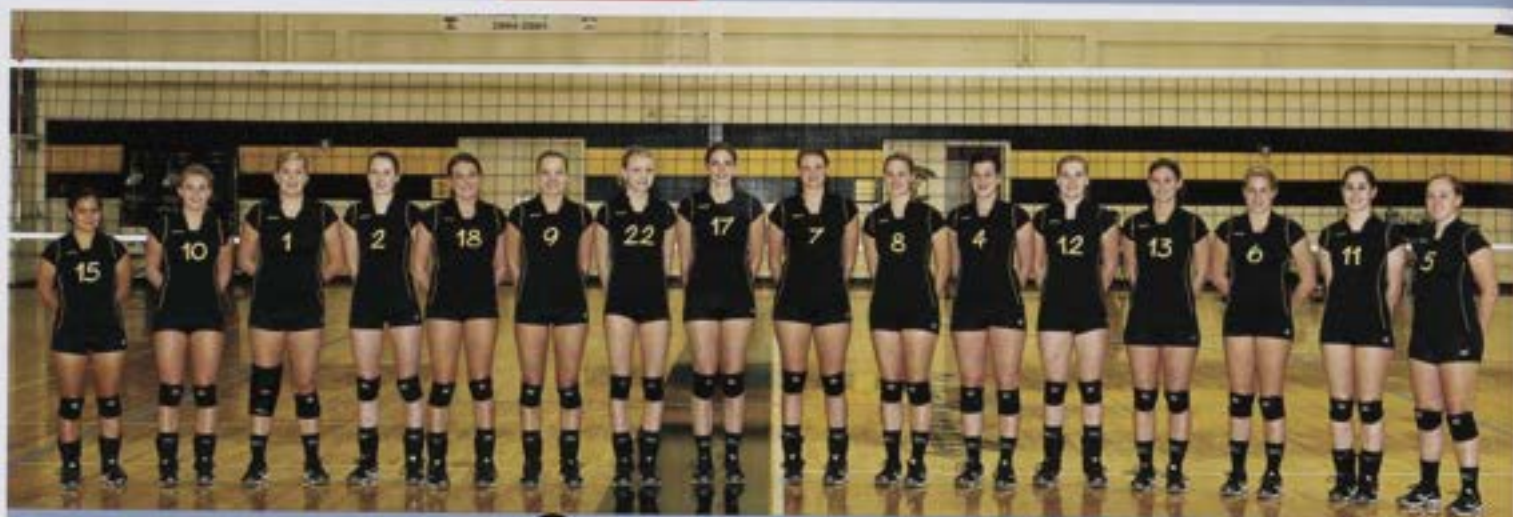

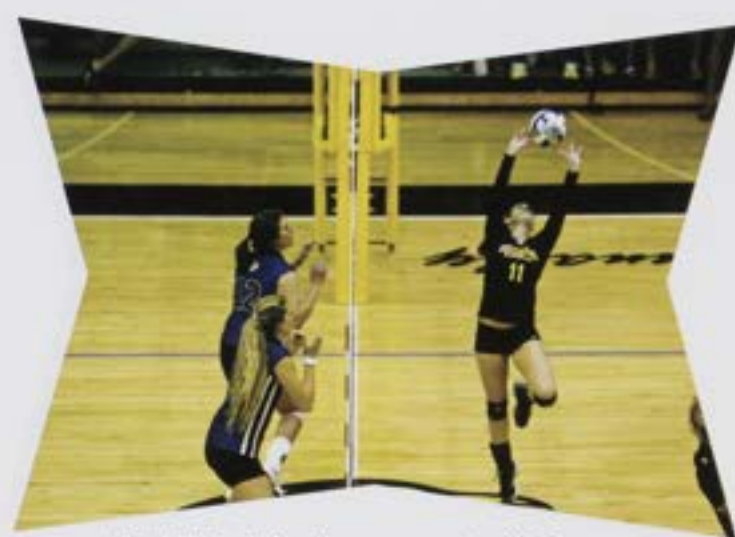
