Soccer Team Gains State Finals, Fall Short Of Title

One loss separated the Randolph-Macon soccer team from a VISA (State) championship. After ten games the Jackets were 4-5-1 and it was apparent that a post season NCAA bid was out of the question. The Jackets then set their eyes upon a state championship and recorded six straight victories. The Jackets easily won their district championship and faced Lynchburg College, a victor over the Jackets earlier in the season, for the Division title. Macon tasted revenge, knocking off Lynchburg by a score of 2-1. The Jackets' opponent for the state title was William and Mary, but the Division I Indians defense proved to be too much for the Jackets, edging Macon 1-0.

Part of the early season blues for the Jackets was because of the competitive schedule they faced. Four of the teams R-MC faced in the opening games went on to post season play.

Griff Sims was the offensive spark for the Jackets all season as the sophomore finished with thirteen goals. Coach Helmut Werner described Sims as "one of, if not the most dangerous offensive players in Virginia." Two-time All-American Mike Gloster holds the career scoring record (44 goals) at Macon but Werner sees Sims as a possible threat to the mark. Sims, after two years of play, has 17 goals.

The Jackets' defense was a question mark early in the season but, after sophomore Tetsu Kimura was moved from his forward position to the outside full-back position and with senior Ken Williams having another outstanding year, the unit recorded shut-outs.

The Yellow Jackets dominated the first team All-State team with four choices — senior goalie Ken Williams, senior defender John Walker, sophomore defender Tetsu Kimura, and sophomore attacker Griff Sims. All-American selections were John Walker.

While Werner's team was on their way to a 10-6-1 season, he was also receiving honors. Werner was named as a charter member to the Lynchburg Sports Hall of Fame. Werner led the country in scoring and assists in 1960 and became the first All-American in any sport in Lynchburg College history. He was also voted Coach of the Year in Virginia.

The Jackets will be losing six seniors from the 1978 squad, including Walker, Williams, Jack Black, and Jim Stepahin. Some professional soccer teams have expressed interest in Walker and Williams. Williams ended his career with 27 shutouts in 48 games.

Football Team Wins ODAC Thrashes H-S Tigers

An ODAC championship, a new career leading rusher, a Coach of the Year award for Ted Keller, and a victory over arch-rival Hampden-Sydney highlighted Randolph-Macon's 1978 football season. The Jackets, who posted a 5-4 record on the year, went undefeated (4-0) in the ODAC, wrapping up the title with an impressive 27-14 victory over the Sydney Tigers. Meanwhile, senior tailback Mike Woolfolk was picking up enough yardage on the ground to eclipse Howard Stevens' career rushing mark.

Salisbury State throttled the Jackets' offense on opening day by intercepting four Macon passes en-route to a 14-0 victory. The Jackets dropped their next contest to the Towson State Tigers by a score of 30-26. The Jackets scored 20 points in the final quarter but the comeback was too little, too late as the Tigers held on for the victory. The following week the Jackets started their ODAC sweep, defeating the Washington & Lee Generals by a score of 28-14. The Jackets then returned home after the victory, only to be overwhelmed by the Davidson Wildcats by a score of 42-0. The Jackets played well against the Division I-AA opponent for three quarters as the Wildcats scored 35 of their points in the final 18 minutes of play. Woolfolk picked up the offense the next week, rushing for 188 yards in the Jackets' 42-14 victory over Emory and Henry, another ODAC opponent. Keller said "the offense and the defense finally got together" as the defense got the ball for the offense on eight occasions with six interceptions, a fumble recovery, and a blocked punt. Senior quarterback Butch Butler also had an excellent game as he passed for one touchdown, ran for another, and, as Keller stated, "worked the option to perfection." The Jackets' Homecoming game was doubly

sweet as they recorded a 27-0 victory over the Guilford Quakers while Woolfolk gained 96 yards rushing, giving him 2,602 career yards and the R-MC career rushing mark. Howard Stevens finished his career at Macon with 2,574 yards. Woolfolk's football career was sadly brought to an end the following week in the Jackets' 21-10 loss to the James Madison Dukes. Woolfolk suffered a broken vertebrae in the neck in the first quarter and the injury kept him sidelined for the remaining of the season. Butch Butler was also injured in the contest. Butler was sidelined for the next contest but sophomore quarterback, Todd Groome, performed well, completing five of six passes for 110 yards and two touchdowns in the Jackets' 32-6 ODAC victory over the Bridgewater Eagles. The next week was for "all the marbles" as Keller said. The Jackets were to face the Hampden-Sydney Tigers and the ODAC title was on the line. The Jackets scored all 27 of their points in the first half as the offense was led by sophomore tailback David Beatty who finished the day with 163 yards rushing (135 in the first half). The Jackets afterwards coasted to a 27-14 victory and Mike Woolfolk received the game ball.

Woolfolk went on to be voted to first team All-ODAC for the third straight year and Ted Keller was named ODAC Coach of the Year for the second time in three years. Tight end Blair Webb and guard Brian Sweaney joined Woolfolk on the offensive All-ODAC team while end Chip King, lineman Ricky Eades, and defensive back Mark Harman were named to the defensive All-ODAC unit. Second team All-ODAC choices were Alex McManus, Bob Brinkley, Todd Collier, Mike McLendon, Keith Sweaney, Brent Cunningham, Doug Mason, and Bill Koepsel.

Basketball Team Suffers Through Year Of Hardships Last Minute Defeats

The Yellow Jackets basketball season can best be summed up by looking at their average scoring as compared to their opponent's scoring. After 25 games the Jackets were outscoring their opponents by a tenth of a point (65.6 to 65.5) but their record stood at 9-16.

Out of those losses, ten were by four points or less while two others were by six and seven. It was one of those years where, when the games came down to the wire, the good breaks usually went to the opponents.

The caliber of the squad can be seen in a few of those losses. In two contests with U.M.B.C., a team ranked in the nation's top ten on occasion, the Jackets dropped both games by a total margin of eight points. In a game with Division I University of Richmond, a team which took Wake Forest into two overtimes, the Jackets barely missed a win as a last second shot rolled off the back of the rim and Macon lost a 45-44 contest at home.

The Jackets scoring usually lay in the hands of four players — guards Stewart Nelson and Dave Meleski, and forwards Paul Gartlan and Jim McGuire, a forward who added a new dimension to the Jackets with a pure shooting touch from anywhere on the court. Mark Bosher and Danny Cridlin also performed well at the center spot while John Phillips, the squad's only senior, was always an inspirational leader on and off the court whose quickness was an asset to Macon's full-court pressure defense.

The Jackets will face another rigid schedule next year but, with the experience gained from this past season, the future looks bright.

The high point of the season was the Jacket's last home game against Loyola College, a team with a shot at the regionals. The Jackets finally put everything together, giving their fans a 69-65 victory. The same squad which won that contest will return next season, as the Jackets will lose only one senior.
